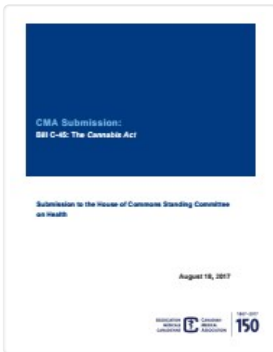

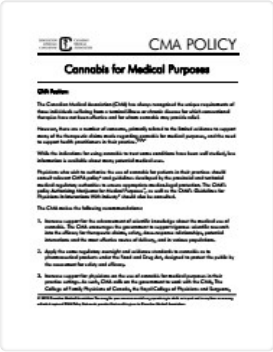

Dear Senator Samson:

The Canadian Medical Association (CMA) welcomes the opportunity to provide comments to the Senate Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs concerning the Bill C-2, an Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts, which will continue our commitment to the protection of the proposed legislation that relates to proposed drug.

Canada's physicians support measures aimed at reducing the incidence of drug-resistance, the better management of pain, and the reduction of the burden of drug use on the health care system. The Committee has received letters from all provinces and other interested parties.

Parliamentary questions about the proposed drug use in the following table are in the Bill C-2. We note that:

- Research from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) suggests that all of the population have been under the influence of cannabis in the past year, an increase from 16.1% in 2003 and 16.4% in 2004.
