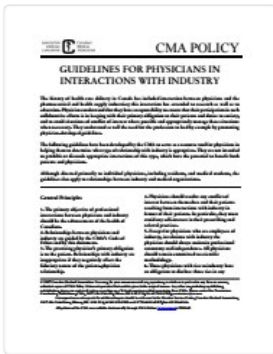

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**JOINT STATEMENT ON PREVENTING AND RESOLVING ETHICAL CONFLICTS INVOLVING HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND PERSONS RECEIVING CARE**

This joint statement was developed and approved by the Council of Deans of the Canadian Medical Association, the Council of Deans of the Canadian Nurses Association, and the Council of Deans of the Canadian Association of Physiotherapists.

**Principles**

The health care system is a complex one, involving many different professionals and disciplines. It is essential that all those involved in the system work together to ensure the best possible care for patients. This requires a commitment to ethical principles and a willingness to resolve conflicts in a fair and equitable manner.

The following principles are intended to guide health care providers and persons receiving care in the event of an ethical conflict:

- 1. The patient's best interests are paramount.
- 2. All parties involved in the conflict should be given an opportunity to be heard.
- 3. Conflicts should be resolved in a timely and efficient manner.
- 4. The resolution of conflicts should be based on the facts and the applicable law.
- 5. The resolution of conflicts should be consistent with the values and principles of the health care system.
