The Canadian Medical Association (CMA) welcomes the opportunity to provide comments to the Senate Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs concerning the Bill (C-2) you have introduced to amend the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts, and to continue our commitment to the protection of the proposed legislation that relates to proposed drug

Canada's objectives support measures aimed at reducing the incidence of drug-resistance, the future availability of drugs, and the safety of patients. In the interest of patient safety, health care professionals, and the public, we support the proposed legislation.
