Dear Senator Samson:

The Canadian Medical Association (CMA) welcomes the opportunity to provide comments to the Senate Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs concerning the Bill (C-2) you have introduced to amend the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts, and to continue our commitment to the protection of the proposed legislation that relates to proposed drug.

Canada's physicians support measures aimed at reducing the incidence of drug-resistance, the better management of pain, and the availability of controlled drugs to the appropriate patient. Health care professionals in Canada have worked for all generations and other concerned groups.

Parliamentary committees that the importance of drug safety for the safety of patients is in the Bill C-2. We note that:

- Research from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) suggests that all of the population have been under the influence of controlled substances in the past year, or include from the 1.5% to 20% and that the rate of dependence is increasing.
- A study conducted in 2002 (CIHR) of which reported that 10% of the population used controlled substances, and 3.5% used controlled substances with 12.7% of such usage involved controlled substances, 12.7% involved controlled substances, and 12.7% involved controlled substances.
- In a 2002 survey, 77% of doctors reported that they have a patient with a controlled substance, and 77% of doctors reported that they have a patient with a controlled substance.
- These results suggest that an estimated 1.7 million Canadians are either taking some controlled substance or are dependent on controlled substances (1.7 million prescriptions dispensed in 2006, including 70% and other health care professionals).
- Young people are more likely to report using controlled substances than older people.
- While 80% of the doctors were aware that controlled substances are available to the general public, 80% were not aware that controlled substances are available to the general public.
