

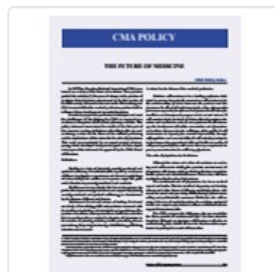

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JOINT STATEMENT ON PREVENTING AND RESOLVING ETHICAL CONFLICTS INVOLVING HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND PERSONS RECEIVING CARE

This joint statement was developed and approved by the Council of Deans of the Canadian Medical Association and the Council of Deans of the Canadian Nurses Association in 1998.

Purpose
The purpose of this statement is to provide a framework for the prevention and resolution of ethical conflicts involving health care providers and persons receiving care. It is intended to be used as a guide for the development of policies and procedures that address these conflicts. The statement is based on the principles of respect for autonomy, beneficence, non-maleficence, and justice. It recognizes the importance of communication and collaboration between health care providers and persons receiving care in the prevention and resolution of ethical conflicts. The statement also recognizes the need for ongoing education and training for health care providers in the area of ethics and professional conduct.
